The study, conducted by the Department of Commerce, utilizes data collected by MSAC from FY 2020 grant recipients. The study does not include the economic impact of non-profit arts organizations in Maryland that do not receive funding from MSAC, for-profit arts organizations, and the activities of individual visual, performing, and literary artists.
